Trade update (year to date October 2021) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Total port trade down 8.3%: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Outer Harbour imports down 12%, mainly due to end of bulk crude petroleum imports since February at BP. OH imports expected to increase next year with refined petroleum imports increasing. ○ Exports down 12% mainly due to decreases of bauxite and refined petroleum. ○ Non-containerised Inner Harbour trade up 11% (imports of new motor vehicles, industrial/agricultural vehicles, metal manufactures all up) ○ Bulk trade: Kwinana Bulk Terminal and Kwinana Bulk Jetty down 29% ○ Ship arrivals up 22 visits (5%) ○ Large container ships now being turned on arrival in Inner Harbour ○ COVID-19: Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic (February 2020), Fremantle Ports has safely handled more than 2,700 ships without a single case of COVID-19 transmission to the community through the Port of Fremantle. Medals were awarded to 174 employees who have contributed to this effort. • Reconciliation Action Plan update: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ 84% of the workforce (including labour hire) have now attended one of the 12 cultural awareness sessions provided for staff. 	10 mins	Sean
3. Swan River Crossings Project update Extensive stakeholder and community consultation to date; alignment has been determined – new road and rail bridge to be constructed within the existing road and rail bridge, high-speed PSP on west side of road bridge, shared zone promenade on eastern side. Main Roads has appointed an alliance team to take the project from design through to construction; community consultation now underway to determine and refine design aspects; Fremantle Ports supports the project, is a partner in the project	5 mins	Neil

Benefits flowing to the port, industry and community: enhanced port and supply chain efficiency; increased rail capacity and associated mode share; removal of existing morning and afternoon commuter peak 'curfews' allowing more daytime operation, less impact on local community; removal of more trucks from the road; based on current usage > 100,000 truck movements/year are removed from the road. Construction is anticipated to start in early 2022 and finish in 2025.</p>		
<p>4. Victoria Quay update</p> <p>Updates were provided on the Gage Roads Brew Co. development at A Shed (opening in early 2022), new café The Freo Merchant at B Shed and the film studio proposal (Fremantle Ports has prepared its submission for the Department of Finance).</p>	5 mins	Neil

Community investment</p> <p>Information provided on the very successful roving theatre production <i>Harbouring Secrets</i>, 6 performances held 4-6 November, which raised about \$5000 for the Flying Angel Club for Seafarers.</p> <p>Recent sponsorships: Castaways Sculpture Awards 23-31 October in Rockingham; Fremantle Sea Scouts for refurbishing 6 moorings; major sponsor of White Gum Valley Primary School's 120 Year Celebration and Fete; Fremantle Long Table, which raised money for St Patrick's Community Support Centre.</p> <p>Victoria Quay events coming up: Perth Festival opening event <i>Escape</i> at Victoria Quay on 11 & 12 February; Lights Up Christmas colouring in competition; <i>Victoria Quay Christmas Concert ... and all that jazz</i> on 11 December; Fremantle Ports Maritime Day on 12 March 2022.</p>	10 mins	Neil

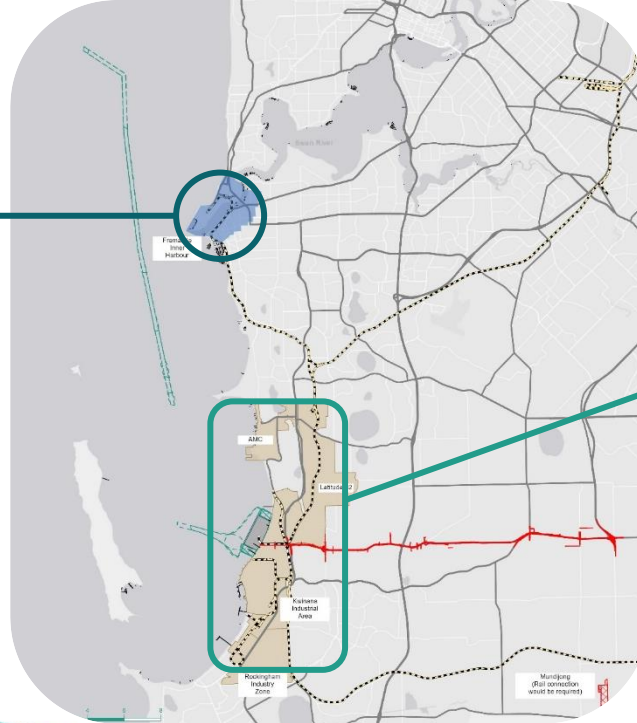


The bigger picture

The transition of containers out of the Inner Harbour unlocks opportunities to respond to Fremantle's changing needs and allow for future growth.



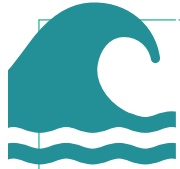
Western Trade Coast

Focus on marine environmental issues relating to port/container terminal development in Cockburn Sound



Focus on terrestrial environmental issues relating to construction / enhancement of Anketell Rd, freight rail network, logistics infrastructure (intermodal terminals, empty container parks)

Consultation is key

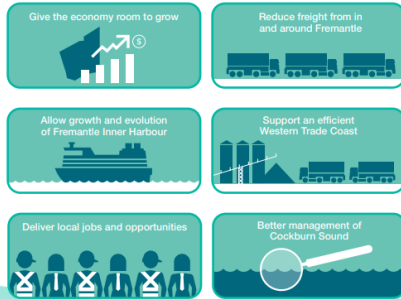
